
Map of Theban Necropolis












Tomb of Nakht, 18th Dynasty, c. 1390 BC, Scribe and Astronomer of Thutmose IV, Western Thebes, Egypt



On both registers the couple Nakht and Tawy, are, according to the text, "enjoying and beholding beauty" by the sight of the offerings which are presented to them.


